"Kertas Krafting" is an Upcycling program in a joint effort with Taylor's Nature Club (TNC) committees, aiming to conduct a one-day programme for underprivileged children from the refugee community. The objective is to provide an experiential learning opportunity for refugee students to understand the importance of upcycling and repurposing waste. Nurturing young minds on sustainability will help raise awareness of environmental protection. The modules were conducted by TNC committees and took place physically at the Warrior Bride Learning Centre.

Objectives

- To boost ethical self-awareness about recycling and waste management
- To aid in mental distress and encourage creative expression
- To foster teamwork and bonding session




History



Summary of Activities

The program commenced with an introduction, outlining the planned activities: Paper Making and Craft stations. Subsequently, the participants were divided into two groups.

At the Paper Making station, Maisha Kareem and Tan Zi Yi guided the participants through the step-by-step process of creating recycled paper including pulping, pressing, and drying. The participants were able to actively participate in each stage, gaining hands-on experience in the art of papermaking. This activity not only imparted insights into the paper-making process but also fostered creativity and independence among the participants.

Meanwhile, the Craft station allowed participants to explore their artistic side through Craft Textured Painting on Canvas. Nurina Najwa provided guidance on techniques and tips for creating textured paintings using recycled paper. Jocelyn Chia facilitated the session, ensuring a smooth and engaging experience. Templates were prepared by TNC, giving participants a starting point for their designs. However, they were encouraged to personalize their artwork and express their unique ideas and preferences.

Both sessions provided an opportunity for the participants to learn new skills, foster creativity, and develop a deeper understanding of upcycling. The programme at the Warrior Bride Learning Centre successfully engaged the participants and instilled a sense of environmental consciousness while nurturing their artistic abilities





Winner Selection

The outcome of activities of the day was concluded with a short presentation from the participants on their Canvas paintings. This opportunity enabled the participants to increase confidence in their presentation skills in front of their peers. TNC nominated the Top 5, 15, and 20 participants based on their overall creativity, explanation of their painting, and active participation during the program. The winners were rewarded with AEON vouchers worth a total of RM 500.






